At 6:00 p.m. Mayor Millis stated this is the time and place according to law to conduct a public hearing to receive input and consider vacating a portion of the public alley easement described as the North 16' of Lots 4 and 9, Block 37, plat of Grand Rapids First Addition and as described in Itasca County Record #193634. Interim City Clerk Alto stated all required notices, according to law, have been met.

Community Development Director Rob Mattei provided background information noting there were no concerns or objections regarding the easement vacation from the staff review committee, and on November 1, 2007 the Planning Commission formally reviewed the proposed vacation and recommended to the City Council approval of the alley easement vacation.
